Together with his cousin Lizzie Post, Dan answers 21st century etiquette questions on [Aweso me Etiquette](#), a podcast from American Public Media.

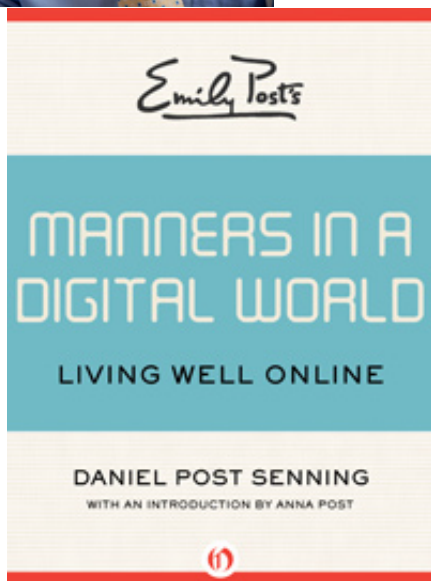
